Dear Families

Our 100th day of school will be on Tuesday February 15, 2010. We will be doing several activities that day to celebrate 100 successful days of school! To mark this day, we will be counting collections of items by 1's, 2's, 5's, and 10's. Practice with your child to see how many ways they can count to 100.

As a special project, I have asked the children to think of something they could make at home which uses **a hundred things**. For example, they could make a lego structure using 100 pieces of lego, they could write 100 words they know on a page, or make a special craft using 100 pieces. If your child made a 100 day celebration in a previous year, I ask that you help your child create a new creation for this year, a GREAT educational experience!

The main goal of the project is to gain practice counting to 100 in various ways and to have fun! These projects are intended to be completed by the child with parental guidance, so keep it simple and fun. We are sending this so you and your child can start to think about and work on this project.

Collections may be sent to school from February 10th on. All collections will be returned after we have sufficient time to talk about and admire them. Please encourage your child to practice talking about his/her 100 day collection prior to bringing it to school.
